Natives for SONGBIRDS

Warblers, Towhees, Wrens, Waxwings, Robins, Thrashers, Finches, Sparrows, Thrushes, Kingbirds, Tanagers, Bluebirds, Orioles and Mockingbirds are all common and familiar songbirds that live in wilderness areas, on the outskirts of town, or even in our neighborhoods and parks. Insects and seeds make up most of the diet, but berries offer an important supplement when little else is available. The following native plants are attractive shrubs that produce berries and attract these colorful birds from miles around!
